# Fauntleroy Park

Fauntleroy Park features 32.9 acres of trees towering above a lush understory and network of trails. Trillium, skunk cabbage, and other wildflowers abound in spring, and various bird species thrive. The park protects the headwaters of year-round Fauntleroy Creek.

- Limited wheel access
- Keep dogs on leash and out of the water.
- No restrooms
- Fell logs for benches

### Places of interest

- A** Best view of the well-vegetated creek is here.
- B** Students release coho fry here in the spring.
- C** Boardwalk ensures year-round trail access.
- D** Views of trees are everywhere.
- E** Before city purchase in 1971, this area was plumed for housing.
- F** Annual student research tracks water quality.
